# Celebrating 40 years...

# ...a brief history



St James Church has been serving the community for over 100 years. The first St James was a tin tabernacle built in the 1870s. A large brick building, St James Forest Gate, was built in 1882 on the corner of St James Road and Forest Lane, and later enlarged to seat 1,200 people. In 1961 the Church was found to be unsafe and had to be demolished. The congregation was faithful and for a time services continued at Durning Hall. After much work, particularly from Bill Wade, churchwarden, and

We are celebrating the 40 years of ministry at this end of the street, and a steady growth in our church.

## Special celebrations

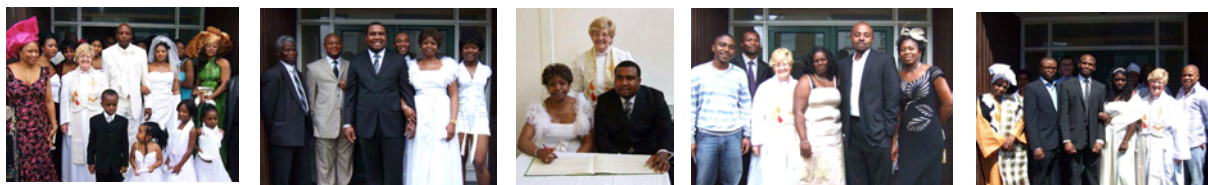
September 2007 saw a very special confirmation; after a gap of more than ten years, the service was held at St James. Bishop David enjoyed the service, and asked to take a copy of one of our new St James songs, "Jesus is Lord". Candidates at that service included Tina Vinson our pianist, as well as Gareth Annable, Nathan Okello and Seun Lazeez. On 18<sup>th</sup> May 2008 seven St James members were confirmed, Allwell Chiukwu, Daniel Mitchell, Florence Onyebuchi, Julain Iyawe, Kate Idemudia, Lucky Efe, and Maris Ogiomade. They were confirmed by Bishop David at St Saviour's church.

The first baptism in 2007 was Miriam Afriye in April, then Destiny Anyanwu in August, Seun Lazeez in September, Emmanuel Clarkson also in September. In December three adults were baptised at the same service, Allwell, Lucky and Julian. In February 2008 Jaiden Abbott Abbey was baptised, and on Easter Sunday 2008 Malvyn Sacko, Maris Ogiomade and Henry Kerson. Kate Idemudia was baptised at St Saviour's during the confirmation service and Charis Campbell Jean-Charles on July 20<sup>th</sup> which brings the grand total to six babies, one young person, and six adults baptised between January 2007 and the end of July 2008. We extend our congratulations to everyone involved and pray for their journeys with each other and with the St James Church family.

We have also supported a project for orphans in Sierra Leone , The great news is that the people supported by this project have now returned to live with their extended families.
